PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

In my first contribution to the Airds Announcer, I would like to thank all those students, parents and staff who have made my start at Airds a most enjoyable and enlightening one.

After 4 weeks as Principal I can say that the school is fortunate to have a large number of highly skilled and motivated staff who want to make a difference. The school resources are outstanding, and the vast majority of students I have meet, have pride in the school and appreciate and understand the value learning will make to their lives.

Student involvement and success

It has been a busy time, Khoder Khalil and Kate Edgerton were great ambassadors for the school when they assisted at the Gary Waldon Trust dinner. Jeremy Cuthbert and Soumaya Saleh received community service awards at the Campbelltown Rotary Youth Excellence awards and a number of students assisted with the Anti Poverty assembly on Friday 20th November.

NAPLAN results

For those parents who do not have students in Years 7 and 8, you should be happy to know that our Year 7 students gained the greatest value added improvements in reading, writing, numeracy and overall literacy in our local School Education Group (SEG). Improvements greater than state average across those areas was a fantastic result and credit must go to all local feeder primary schools for their great work. In Year 9 our NAPLAN results in Numeracy showed improvements greater than state average and the best in the SEG. The schools in our SEG include; Ambarvale, Campbelltown Performing Arts, Leumeah, Thomas Reddall and Airds. Well done Airds on such great results.

In 2010 the focus will continue on improving basic skills in Literacy and Numeracy, and improving content knowledge and understanding in Stage 5 and 6 to ensure our students gain the best possible results in the SC and HSC.

In order to ensure that students can make the most of their learning time and for teachers to focus on the job of

providing quality teaching it is essential that a number of present student practices need to change.

Student Responsibility

I have observed in a very short period of time that the generosity of staff has shifted the responsibility away from the student to a dependence on the staff and school. Unfortunately this will not develop the necessary skills that will enhance and promote student independence.

The following 4 areas; lateness, equipment, uniform and mobile phones, will be addressed in 2010 and students, parents and staff will need to support these changes to ensure that the primary focus of the school is on; learning, safety and responsibility.

Lateness: As far too many students are arriving late to school, the timetable for 2010 has been modified to have the first class lesson of the day commence at 8.30am. Students are expected to be in attendance at all lessons and work missed due to poor attendance will be required to be completed in the students own time. Not being awarded a SC or HSC may be the unfortunate result for students who do not meet BOS courses requirements satisfactorily.

Equipment: It is a school wide expectation that all students should present at school fully equipped to complete any task that is required. This is fundamental to successful learning and ensures that teachers can deliver all components of the curriculum successfully. Learning and the responsibility that goes with it is everyone's responsibility and student preparedness is fundamental to their success at school.

Uniform: Supporting the school uniform code promotes a number of positives. Students who arrive at school in uniform come with the expectation that they are here to learn. They have decided that school is important, and by being prepared in uniform and with all equipment, they are ready to go about the daily business of learning. They also know that they will be recognised members of the school community (safety) and promote a sense of pride in themselves and the school in general. It must be noted that the wearing of leather shoes is a requirement at school and thus ensures students can engage in all curriculum based activities. Specifically, Science, TAS, Metal Work, Woodwork, Hospitality and Art, are all subjects that Work Cover require students to be wearing



closed leather shoes. Blue denim jeans are not part of the school uniform and therefore must not be worn to school. Students should ensure they have an ample supply of uniform to support the school uniform code 5 days a week (i.e. at least three school shirts and 2 pair of pants or shorts). With Christmas almost upon us, it is an ideal time to put uniform on your Christmas list, so you can experience all that Airds has to offer in 2010.

Mobile Phones: I have noticed the negative impact that the use of phones has had on both the learning environment and social interactions of students at Airds High School. To fall in line with all other high schools, students will not be allowed to use mobile phones at anytime during the school day. I appreciate that students may be required to have their phone with them, on their trip to and from school, but once they have arrived at school, phones should not be SEEN, HEARD or USED during the school day.

Airds High School is determined to make a difference to your child's learning outcomes. It can only do this when a student's primary focus at school is on learning. To this end, supporting the above changes will make a considerable difference to the outcomes of students and the quality of the learning and overall school environment.

I would like to wish all students, staff and parents a most enjoyable and relaxing holiday and I look forward to what should be a great year in 2010.



A new initiative by Macarthur Workplace Learning Program and MG My Gateway gives HSC students, who have performed exceptionally well during their work placement in industry, a unique opportunity.

MWLP gathers feedback from host employers following a student's work placement. Students receiving outstanding feedback receive a Certificate of Achievement and are listed on an Honour Roll which MWLP will present to each school.

Not only are students then recognised by their Principals, teachers and peers they are also given the chance to undergo an interview with local group training organisation MG My Gateway for a future traineeship or apprenticeship.
